#### Songleader's notes:


- Psalm 133 is the thirteenth of fourteen "Psalms of Ascents," songs for pilgrimage to Mount Zion. Picture people hiking and singing as they travel to the most wonderful place they know.
- The first simile for community (133.2) is anointing oil dripping down Aaron's beard. Oil represents lavish hospitality and joy, as ordaining the head of their beloved priest Aaron.
- The second simile (133.3) is that of dew from Mount Hermon falling on Mount Zion. Since geographically Mount Hermon and Mount Zion are a good 120 miles apart, the expression brilliantly describes the ingathering range of God's family.
- In the psalm, the blessing of "life forevermore" has nothing to do with agreeing on politics or theology. It doesn't mention sin and redemption. In Psalm 133, the greatest blessing of God is living together as a colorful, creative community.




